
INTRODUCING THE CLIMATE COMEDY COHORT:
INTERSECTING CREATIVE AND CLEAN ENERGY STRATEGY

Launched in 2022, the Climate Comedy Cohort (CCC) is an unprecedented network of comedians who come together to learn, collaborate, and create hilarious new comedy informed by the hottest climate science.

Co-created and co-directed by the Center for Media & Social Impact's GoodLaugh initiative and clean energy nonprofit Generation180, the Climate Comedy Cohort brings together diverse comedians from around the country to flip the script on the way we think about climate change. The ultimate aim: to leverage humor as a cultural strategy to change the climate narrative from doom and gloom to "we've got this!"—and shift how people see their role in clean energy.

Public opinion research shows that the majority of Americans are concerned about climate change, but most know little about meaningful steps they can take. There's a lot more people can do – actions beyond recycling or bringing their own bags to the grocery store. Comedians like Chris Rock, John Oliver, and Wanda Sykes have used comedy as a way to confront issues that may otherwise seem intimidating to tackle in everyday conversation. And that's exactly why it's necessary to support comedians in creating content around climate change.

The CCC approach focuses on investing in comedians as clean energy ambassadors who are agents of change committed to climate action that lasts beyond the program—and creating original comedy that tackles the biggest problem facing the world today. By bringing talented professional comedians together with some of the country's most important experts in climate change science and communication, the the Climate Comedy Cohort allows the best of both worlds—comedy creativity and climate science—to collaborate and shape meaningful entertainment content designed to inspire public awareness and engagement.

HOW THE CCC PROGRAM WORKS

COLLABORATION AND CREATIVE PRODUCTION ACROSS SCIENCE AND COMEDY

Application and Selection

Structured as a nine-month fellowship, each cohort of fellows was chosen from a competitive juried process, and hundreds of diverse comedians applied. The fellows were chosen based on a combination of the strength of their comedic voice, commitment to climate issues and level of comedic experience.













Comedy ThinkTanks with Experts

Building relationships across the wildly disparate worlds of professional comedy and climate change science is core to the **CCC** approach, and the process is designed to be immersive for both. Led by the **Climate Comedy Cohort** partners, the fellows participated in a weeklong intensive workshop and comedy writers' room as the heart of the creative process. The weeklong event called the Climate Comedy ThinkTank—a model based on GoodLaugh's co-creation model—featured presentations from experts across climate change science, behavior change, climate communication, clean energy technology, climate justice, and climate journalism. During the creative week, modeled after a comedy TV show writers' room, comedians received an immersive education about climate issues from experts in the field. Comedians were able to increase their knowledge, ask questions, and build their comprehension across a range of climate-focused topics while experts were able to see and understand how creative artists engage with their own complex, policy-driven work. Comedians applied the information that they acquired to brainstorm award-winning comedy ideas, from stand-up to sketch to live show ideas.

Comedy ThinkTank Guidebook Resource

To guide an intensive collaborative experience, the **Climate Comedy Cohort** team developed a new guidebook that distills the hottest climate change and clean energy science into manageable bites of information. Comedians referred to the guidebook at the Climate Comedy Think Tank week, and throughout the course of the nine-month fellowship, in order to shape new original comedy based on the experience.

Webinar Series and Creative Consultation

Over the course of the nine-month fellowship, the **Climate Comedy Cohort** comedians participated in webinars with experts and worked one-on-one with the **CCC** creative comedy team to develop original comedy that produced short-form videos designed for easy public dissemination and live show material, and other content shared via social media.





ORIGINAL COMEDY CREATED BY THE CLIMATE COMEDY COHORT

CCC NYC Pitch Showcase

In June of 2022, following the launch of CMSI's GoodLaugh, the **Climate Comedy Cohort** pitched original climate focused comedy ideas to an audience of climate activists, funders and folks in comedy entertainment. This showcase allowed the cohort to punctuate both their viable ideas and also promote themselves as comedians with something to say. Since this event, many **CCC** members have been hired to do climate comedy in such places as NYC Climate Week and the Hollywood Climate Summit.

Earth to Mars Comedy Tour

In October of 2022, **CCC** comedians hit the road on a live comedy tour, stopping in Mason City, Illinois, Atlanta, Georgia, and Los Angeles, California. The comedians brought their climate-focused stand-up sets to cities across the country, using humor to help audiences think about the daily clean energy choices available in their own lives.

Videos for Public Engagement

In 2022, the **Climate Comedy Cohort** partnered with Comedy Central for a live "takeover" of its instagram stories. **CCC** comedians created a total of 12 original climate videos distributed by Comedy Central, generating impressive public engagement on its social channels.





The Climate Comedy Cohort, co-created and directed by the Center for Media & Social Impact's GoodLaugh initiative and clean energy nonprofit Generation 180, won a Gold Anthem award for Special Projects, an initiative working to build a network of comedians using humor to inspire climate action. The Anthem Awards were developed by The Webby's to recognize the best purpose- and mission-driven work worldwide.

"Induction Stoves," a video created by 2023 **Climate Comedy Cohort** fellow, comedian, and writer Pratima Mani, won a platinum AVA digital award in the digital advertising and video production categories. Notably, the video also won "Most Popular Video" at the Behavior, Energy, and Climate Change (BECC) 2023 conference's Climate Comedy Festival.
